Introduction

JUNE 2019 - JULY 2020

The year from July 1, 2019 – June 30, 2020 was something of a turning point in PEMAC's history. This report briefly highlights some of the activities and milestones including the 1500th MMP designation and 100th CAMP professional designations being awarded, the launch of two new Asset Management awards, the launch of PEMAC Now magazine, the conclusion of a federally funded project, "Federation of Canadian Municipalities (FCM) Municipal Asset Management Program (MAMP)", a successful bid on the next phase of that funding program "MAMP3", and an official change of name for the association from PEMAC Plant Engineering and Maintenance Association of Canada to PEMAC Asset Management Association of Canada. MainTrain 2019 was held this year which was a dynamic and well-attended conference held in Edmonton, Alberta. Given the state of the pandemic at this writing we look back on that event with great fondness and look forward to the possibility of hosting many more like it in the not-too-distant future!

The necessity of responding in earnest to Covid-19 came into focus in March 2020. In good company with organizations, families and individuals around the world, PEMAC had some serious adaptations to make and as an organization we have been fortunate in many ways. The fact that our 2020 conference was still

7 months away and we already had a distributed operation with employees working from home were significant advantages. In addition, a significant percentage of our programs and services were already being delivered online. For planned events that were face to face (Chapter activities, the 2020 conference, some teaching institutions' course deliveries) we had a combination of partnerships and in-house expertise that made the transition relatively seamless. That said, we are aware that the pandemic has negatively impacted many of the organizations and individuals that we serve. We were deeply saddened, for example, to hear about the passing of our first Executive Director, Steve Gahbauer, in May 2020, of complications from Covid-19.

PEMAC remains in a strong position financially, having surpassed \$1MM / year in revenue for the second year in a row with a net positive operating balance.

We are grateful for all those who have participated in our programs and services and promoted the work of the association in their conversations and at their work places. The list of staff and volunteers who have made PEMAC programs and developments possible is included at the end of this report. Apologies in advance to anyone whose name we may have missed.

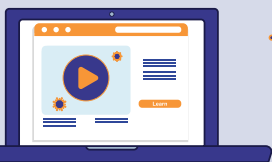

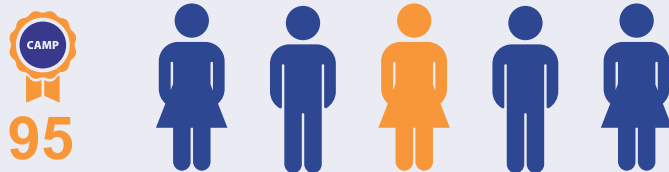

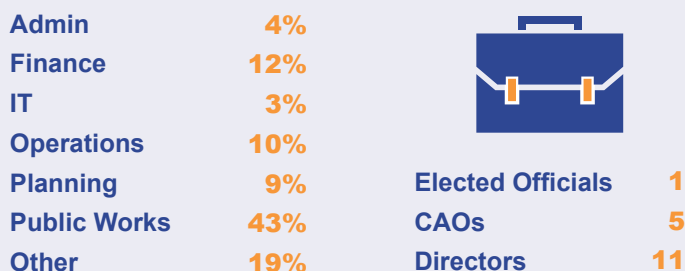


Special Offering of the AMP Program for Municipalities

Certified Asset Management Professionals with a variety of roles:

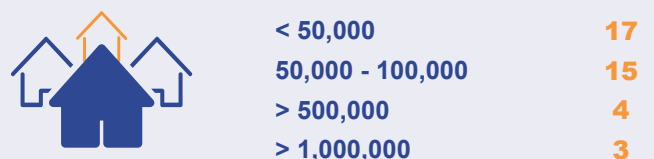
