The Fixed Asset Management Coordinator will lead the initial development as well as the on-going compliance and integration of the asset management system into all processes and procedures.

Reporting to the Asset Reliability Engineering Supervisor, this position is responsible for the following duties:

Responsibilities include:

- Lead the development, implementation, and continued improvement of the Asset Management (AM) system
- Collect and verify asset inventory, condition, and costing data used for life cycle modeling and analysis
- Analyze asset condition data and make recommendations to senior staff
- Provide leadership and training for AM integration to Operations, Maintenance, Technical, Line Management, and Contractor groups
- Lead AM metric generation, including interpretation of data to identify problems and opportunities for improving AM performance
- Assist in updating the fixed assets listings for all equipment including depreciation, expected life, and costs to maintain and/or rebuild to extend the life of the equipment
- Work with site stakeholders to develop integrity programs for assets
- Develop and maintain the asset management registry index
- Provide support to development and implementation of maintenance strategies and PM plans for assets
- Assist with the preparation of the annual budget and forecast
- Ensure project activities comply with regulating authorities (LRWS, Sask. Environment, CNSC, and Sask. Boiler's Branch)
- Creating data visualizations and reports
- Embrace and support Operational Excellence efforts and OE Culture
- Comply with all Orano health, safety and environmental policies, practices and procedures
- Promote and adhere to Orano Canada's values: Customer Satisfaction, Continuous Improvement, Respect and People Development, Cohesion and Team Spirit, and Exemplarity, Integrity, Responsibility
