Westshore Terminals Limited Partnership is owned by Westshore Terminals Investment Corporation. Operating since 1970 in Port of Vancouver, Westshore is the terminal of choice for Canadian coal mines and for United States mines in the Powder River Basin of Montana and Wyoming. Westshore Terminals is capable of handling up to 33 million tonnes of coal annually and ships to over 20 countries worldwide, providing billions in dollars of export revenue for Canada and British Columbia. The terminal is also undergoing a transition as it prepares to diversify by including potash in its export base. Preparation is underway with a target for 2026 to commence loading.

Connecting the mines to Westshore is a network of rail corridors, terminating at Westshore's west coast operations. Each train represents more than 14 jobs and \$3.1 million in economic activity. Westshore is to be proud to be Port Metro Vancouver's only dedicated coal terminal and busiest single coal export terminal in all of North America.

An opportunity exists for an Electrical Superintendent to actively manage the people, planning and production components of Westshore Terminals' electrical operations. The primary role of the Electrical Superintendent will be to manage workforce productivity and work quality by proactively addressing potential delays and obstacles through effective planning, and ensuring the required materials are available and the correct procedures are followed. Reporting to the Manager of Maintenance – Electrical, the Superintendent will work within a team of four Electrical Superintendents, supervising a group of ten Electrical Foremen. Along with meeting the production and maintenance plan for the site, a key deliverable of this role will be coaching, mentoring, and training personnel.

The ideal candidate will bring experience in the electrical trade or engineering in a heavy industrial and unionized environment. Possessing exceptional planning, scheduling, and organizational skills, the successful candidate will have productively managed unionized foremen and supervised day-to-day preventive and corrective maintenance. The incumbent understands the inherent relationships between plant management, operations and maintenance and will then know what best practices must be employed in maintaining and working on industrial power systems from 69kv through 600volts. A key indicator of success will be the incumbent's commitment to creating a work environment where safety is first and foremost in everyone's mind – they will truly believe that workplace safety is a critical component of operational excellence and top financial performance.
