ASSET MANAGEMENT PROFESSIONAL PROGRAM FOR MUNICIPALITIES



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CAMP

PEMAC's Asset Management Professional (AMP) education and certification program is available for municipal practitioners. Teams from municipalities across Canada will take a learning journey together with the goal of meaningfully improving the Asset Management practices of their municipality.

The AMP program introduces participants to the latest in strategic asset management thinking while building organizational capacity for excellence in Asset Management. Participants develop the capacity to engage others and build their knowledge and skills in key subject areas while familiarizing themselves with tools for strategic decision making at each stage of the asset lifecycle.

Designed with the Asset Management Readiness Scale in mind, and aligned with ISO 5500x standards, this specialized program will allow municipal sector practitioners to strengthen their region's approach to managing its assets as they share and learn from one another, while also being guided along the path from plan to execution from leading Asset Management experts.

For a significantly discounted tuition, up to 120 individuals (6 cohorts of 20 people) from Canadian municipalities will take a learning journey together with the aim of meaningfully improving the Asset Management practices. Participants who meet the program assessment criteria at the close of the program will qualify for the PEMAC Certified Asset Management Professional (CAMP) designation. Through this capacity-building program the participants, the municipalities that they serve and the general public will win.

THE PROGRAM

This program is designed for mid-career professionals and senior managers from varied disciplines including engineering, IT, business management and finance, who have responsibility for managing decisions with respect to the core life cycle functions such as design, selection, operation, maintenance of a municipality's assets.

Municipal sector practitioners from across Canada are able to participate in customized versions of the six courses of the AMP program being delivered from December, 2018 to April, 2020. This initiative is delivered through the Municipal Asset Management Program, which is delivered by the Federation of Canadian Municipalities and funded by the Government of Canada. MAMP is designed to help Canadian municipalities strengthen infrastructure investment decisions based on sound asset management practices. The program provides asset management training, funding and information sharing to enable municipalities to access the data needed to plan effectively.

Course 1 is delivered in a face to face setting over five consecutive days, in six cities across Canada.

Courses 2 through 6 are offered by 'asynchronous' online learning where participants are able to connect with instructors and other participants through the learning platform. These courses are 30 hours long plus readings, delivered over a ten-week period and will run from January 2019 through April 2020. Each course is broken down into "weeks" of work, supplemented with weekly online discussions and supported by live Q&A sessions.

Successful completion of the AMP program leads to the "CAMP professional designation". AMP is recognized by the Canadian Network of Asset Managers (CNAM) Education, Research and Training committee.
